Introduction

This Pride In Our City portfolio has been primarily produced to inform you the judges of Britain in Bloom, but also as an informative document for the Ulster in Bloom, Pride of Place and the Best Kept Awards, and will list the ongoing improvements and workings in relation to horticulture, environmental and community involvement throughout the City.

The Pride In Our City campaign has been in existence now for more than 12 years and the delivery of its objectives has been proven on many occasions through the attainment of a range of awards from the competitions mentioned above. This portfolio will highlight those areas and items that shall not be visited on the day of judging and cover a period from late August 2012 to June 2013.







An area that was highlighted in previous judges feedback was in relation to information on the sustainability and funding of the Pride in Our City Campaign.

The sustainability of this campaign was secured with the approval by Council in 2006 of an annual fund of £20,000 to be solely used in relation to this campaign to further improve the three pillars of Horticultural Excellence, Environmental Responsibility, and Community Participation.

In addition application has been successfully made annually to the local Department of Social Development in relation to the Pride In Our City Campaign and we are pleased to say that this year a sum of £50,000 has been secured for the campaign with an additional £30,400 awarded for the purchase of planters and trees to further enhance the riverside and 'Public Realm' areas during this year as the UK City of Culture 2013.

Another area of funding which has generated funding towards the improvement of the City's roundabouts has been the Roundabout Sponsorship Scheme where local businesses have come forward and contributed to the landscaping and maintenance of roundabouts on the main arterial routes, raising this year a sum of £28,775.

Pride In Our City's aim in relation to the arterial routes is to create "hot spots" of colour at the main entrance routes to the city coupled with an enhanced maintenance regime to grassed areas which has been funded by the DRD Road Service and delivered by Council's Parks and Cemeteries Section.





Partners and Stakeholders

DRD Roads Service

Roads Service is pleased to support the aims of The Pride In Our City Campaign by enhancing the appearance of the road network in the area and ensure that maintenance is carried out to the standards laid down in our guidelines. In particular we have worked in conjunction with the Department for Social Development in developing the main "gateways" into the city and have recently completed the works to Queens Quay, Duke Street and Rossville Street. We will work with Derry City Council to ensure best use of greenspace is created by that scheme.

North West Development Office

The Department for Social Development's (DSD) North West Development Office (NWDO) plays a central role in driving forward urban regeneration and community development in Derry and the wider North West. Through a range of funding programmes, and in partnership with regeneration partners in the private, community and voluntary sectors, and other Government Departments and Agencies, NWDO seeks to tackle social, economic and physical regeneration and to redress disadvantage in the city.

NWDO continues to work with local people and key stakeholders to create attractive and safe landscaped spaces that respect local character and encourage community pride.

NWDO has also made a very significant investment in a wide range of public realm improvement projects throughout the city in recent years – areas to benefit from these schemes include Newmarket Street, Guildhall Square/ Waterloo Place, Queens Quay, Castle Street, Clarendon Street, Foyle Street, Spencer Road and Duke Street. The creation of the Foyle Street urban park and the provision of high quality precinct planters and hanging baskets throughout the city centre further complements this work.

As a key partner, NWDO continues to play a full role in supporting and funding initiatives taken forward by Derry City Council that promote the business objectives of both organisations. Examples of these initiatives are support for the Britain in Bloom, Ulster in Bloom, Pride of Place, and Pride in our City projects, facilitation of additional tree planting on the arterial routes into the City, landscaping of roundabouts and the supply of precinct planters for use in and around the city.





ILEX

Ilex is the urban regeneration company for Derry~Londonderry. It is sponsored by the Office of the First Minister and deputy First Minister (OFMDFM), to create and promote the co-ordinated regeneration of the Derry City Council area and to secure the economic, social and physical regeneration of Ebrington, the 26 acre former military site connected to the city by the iconic and multi-award winning Peace Bridge.

Ebrington is currently being redeveloped for cultural, recreational, tourism, hospitality and residential use. Importantly, the prestigious Turner Prize 2013 will be hosted in two former barracks buildings which are at an advanced stage of regeneration. An underground car park is also under way which will bring additional areas of Ebrington back into use and provide connections to the city's extensive cycle network.

Considerable progress has been made to Ebrington Square which is now the largest public space in the city. It has been developed to complement the iconic Peace Bridge and to host a range of cultural and recreational activities. Already, the square has hosted key events such as the Peace One Day concert, the Clipper concerts 2012 and Radio 1's Big Weekend, and many more large scale events are planned for the future.

Northern Ireland Housing Executive

The Housing Executive is Northern Ireland's strategic regional housing authority. Their aim is to provide everyone with the opportunity to access decent, affordable housing services, develop strategies to influence the wider housing market and work with others to foster urban and rural renewal and contribute to improved health and social well being.

City Centre Initiative

City Centre Initiative is the dedicated city centre management company for Derry~Londonderry, integral to the work undertaken by the organisation are projects such as the Pride in Our City campaign, which, continues to make a very positive contribution to the city centre and indeed the city as a whole. The planning and partnership working required for such a competition is ongoing throughout the year with strong working relationships forged and maintained. Never have projects such as Pride in Our City been more important especially since the city is enjoying its City of Culture year celebrations.



A highlight this year has been winning the Team Challenge Silver Medal at Gardenshow Ireland with their Pride In Our City entry 'Let the Music Flow'.






Sow and Grow

Floral Displays

Derry City Council and its partners recognise the valuable contribution that floral displays make in enhancing our civic environment through the provision of hanging baskets, precinct planters, bedding displays and bulb planting within our parks, cemeteries, and roundabouts. In this past year Council has planted:

- 67,700 spring bedding plants,
- 24,000 additional daffodil bulbs, and
- 82,000 summer bedding plants

This summer Council will also display 588 hanging baskets, 119 wall/pole baskets, 325 barrier planters, 40 precinct planters, 9 tree surrounds, and 6 half barrel displays across the city. These figures include 100 hanging baskets, 6 precinct planters, and 130 barrier planters newly purchased this year through welcome funding from the North West Development Office. Additionally a further 6 precinct planters and 18 wall baskets will also be on display at 6 community centre locations as part of our Good Relations project.

Further planting in and around the city this year has also included:

- 674 Trees
- 2,900 whips
- 11,661 Shrubs
- 5,000 bedding plants
- 2,093 Perennials
- 1,100 Bulbs
- 5,760 Grasses
- 9,600 M2 of Wild Flora planting
